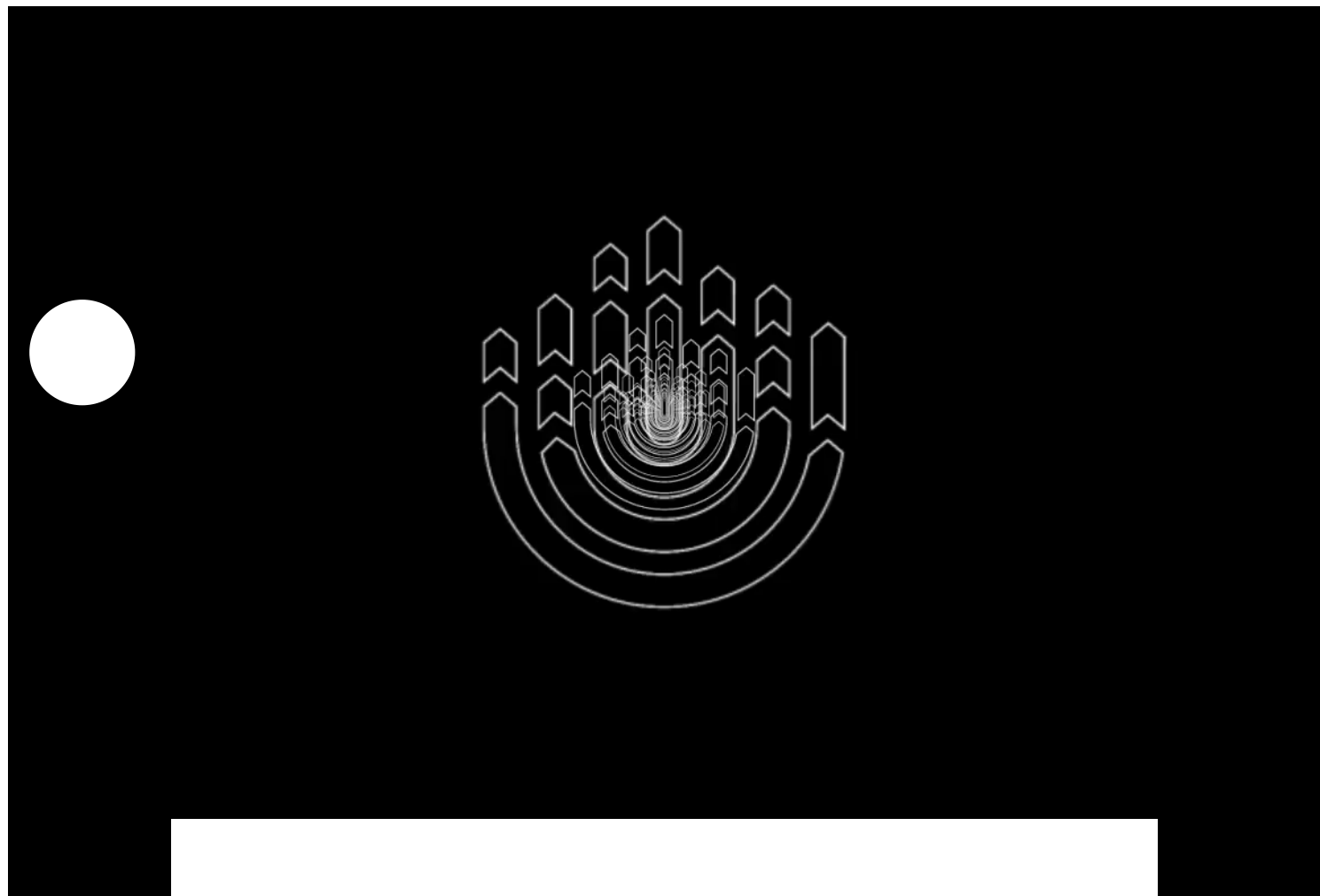

Juneteenth

Juneteenth, celebrated on June 19th, is an American holiday commemorating the end of slavery in the United States. Though President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation in 1863, it was not until two years later when the news finally reached African Americans living in Texas. Not until then, when all slaves had finally been informed and news that they were freed had reached them, was there celebration. That date was June 19th, 1865.

Celebrations began the year following June 19th, 1865, and have continued since. Celebrations of Juneteenth have continued into the 21st century and include prayer, religious services, speeches, educational and informal events, family gatherings, picnics, and festivals with celebrations of African American music, food, dance, and culture.

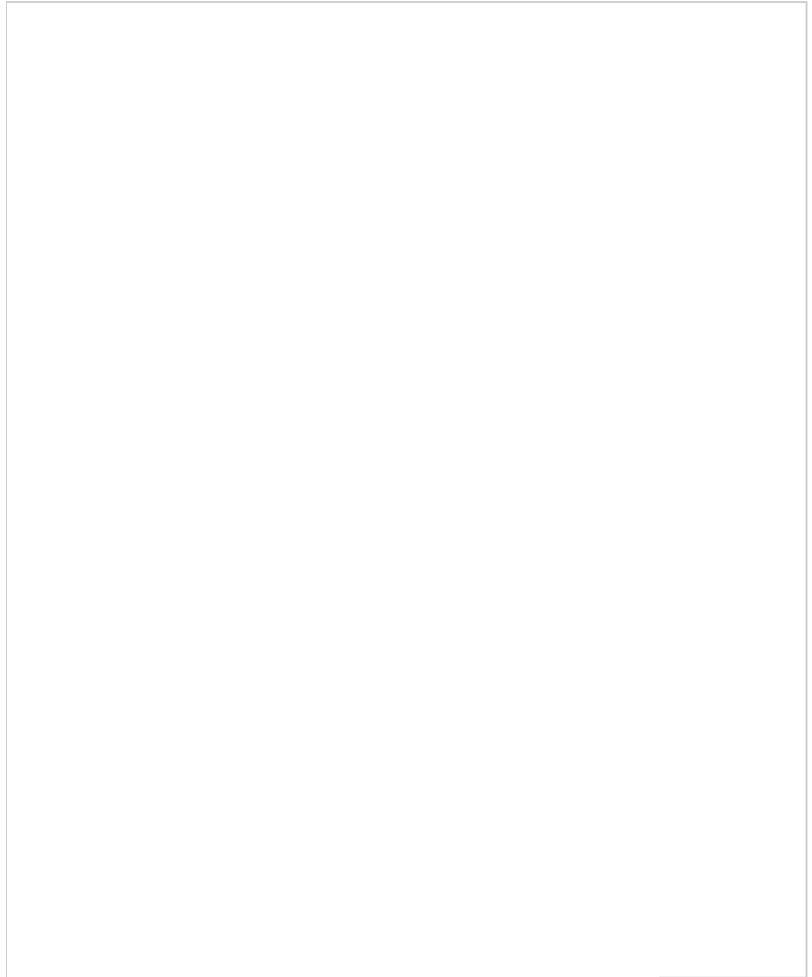

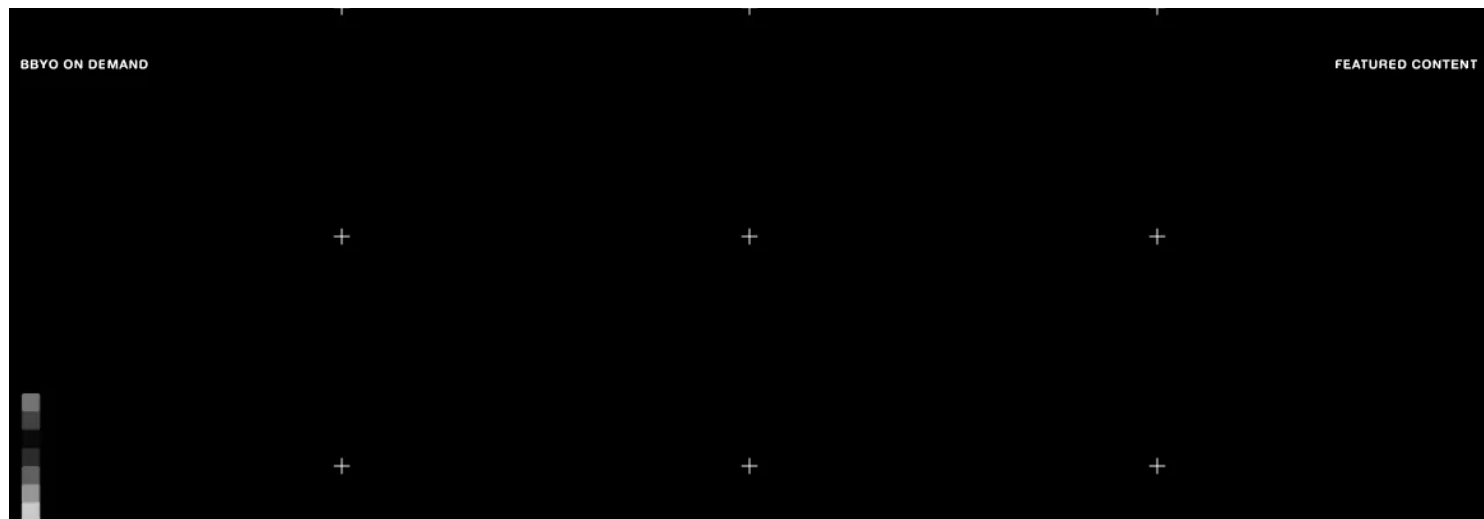
